- Davidson-Davie Community College (College) acknowledges the College signed and returned to the Department of Education (Department) the College's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under CRRSAA and ARP. This includes assurance that the College has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- The College was funded \$5,891,571.00, \$1,318,191 under CRRSAA and \$4,573,380 under ARP, from the Department pursuant to the College's Certification of Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- As of the date of this report, the College distributed to 3,864 students.
 - o Fall 2021: 2,194 students (ARP)
 - Spring 2022: 3,275 students (ARP)
- As of the date of this report, the total number of students who received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant of the ARP Acts using the CRRSAA framework is 3,864. These students received \$2,171,100 in the Fall 2021 distribution and \$2,318,038 in the Spring 2022 distribution.
- The methods used by the College to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants, including how much a student would receive under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA have been determined. See Exhibit 1.
- Students who are eligible to receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant received an email notification. See Exhibit 2.

- We do not make direct payments to students for bills, repairs, or childcare etc. These types of payments are made directly to the provider.
- There is a maximum amount we are able to assist students with but that will be discussed individually with students who apply.

Dear Student,

You have been awarded a grant from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF). These funds were created by the U.S. Congress as part of the *Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021* and the *American Rescue Plan Act of 2021*. This grant is intended to assist you with expenses such as tuition, food, housing, physical and mental health, books, transportation, personal expenses, childcare, and any emergency costs that may have arisen due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

You may view the amount awarded to you by logging into StormTrac and selecting Financial Aid. The grant will be disbursed to you based on the selection you made through the RefundSelect program. If you did not choose a method, your refund will be issued in the form of a paper check. You will receive an email or text from Heartland/ECSI when the refund has been finalized and will advise you of the amount and method of disbursement. The anticipated date of your refund is September 24, 2021.
